

Beloved,

One of my favorite underused pieces of our tradition is our practice of blessing homes. I've written in here before about how we have a few forms for blessing homes. The primary, and most involved, form involves gathering with friends and family members, processing from room to room with prayers said in each room, culminating with a service of Holy Eucharist in the living room. It is such a pleasure and a privilege for me to be able to take part in these services.

We also have a brief form we in January use around the Epiphany. Where there are a couple prayers and then we have the option to chalk the door frame. Chalking the door frame means taking some blessed chalk and writing 20+C+B+M+25 along the door frame. The numbers on the end make up the year, and the C, M, & B, stand for both the traditional names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, & Balthasar) as well as the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* (Christ bless this home).

There's another form, similar in length to the Epiphany blessing, but with no chalk involved. That one can take place anytime during the fifty days of Easter. Easter began on Sunday, April 20th and goes until Pentecost which this year is on Sunday, June 8th . This form includes the recitation of a psalm and a few prayers, lasting around five minutes.
